

## HERITAGE PRESERVATION COMMISSION MINUTES

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The meeting was called to order at 4:00 p.m. by Acting Chairman Hamilton.

The minutes from the Commission's meeting of July 9, 2014, were reviewed. Upon motion by Commissioner Edel Beyer and second by Commissioner Hanson were **unanimously approved as submitted**.

### Public Hearing – Certificate of Appropriateness - Kirch Latsch Building

Acting Chairman Hamilton called on Mark Moeller, City Planner, to provide a summary of this item. Mr. Moeller noted that although a hearing had been scheduled to consider this Certificate of Appropriateness (COA), given additional discussion with the applicant, it had been requested that the hearing not be held this afternoon. In part, this relates to the fact that the redevelopment project of the Kirch Latsch Building will require additional land acquisitions which have not yet been fully accomplished. As such, the applicant felt that the hearing was premature and again requested that it be pulled from this agenda.

### Other Business

Commissioner Edel Beyer noted that she has had additional discussion with the priest at St. Stanislaus Basilica and he is very excited about the Commission's pending Commendation Award of that building. Given previous discussion, it was anticipated that an event awarding the commendation would be held sometime in October. Again, she would discuss this with Chairperson Englund.

Commissioner Kendal Larson noted that in light of the Commission's review of the Kirch Latsch COA, she requested that additional information be provided relative to exterior structural materials and/or details that are proposed. She noted that although existing proposed structure elevations had been included in the Commission's agenda package, they do not fully define all work that will be completed. Mr. Moeller agreed and noted that in part, it had been hoped that the applicant would be able to provide additional

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information to the project. Outside of that, he noted that staff would include additional information with the next agenda package once that hearing is held.

Commissioner Kendal Larson stated that she would like to review parliamentary procedures relating to Commission meetings and actions during the Commission's next meeting. She felt that it was important to have a structured format for discussions and actions and simply wants to reaffirm these.

Commissioner Burke alluded to recent Board of Adjustment actions pertaining to a variance granted to a property located within the Third Street Historic District. She noted that although she had been made aware of the proposal to facilitate additional residential use within the building, other Commissioners were not. Given this, it was suggested that some form of policy or ordinance be developed which would facilitate notification to the Commission when variance requests of any local historic site or district are proposed.

Given the absence of Commissioner Englund this afternoon, it was suggested that this item be more completely discussed during the Commission's next meeting.

**Adjournment**

There being no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting was adjourned.
