

# Winona Biking Rules

Winona, Minnesota biking rules are listed in City Code Section 61.53. The rules also follow State Statute 169.222. Following is a summary of the provisions:

1. Bicyclists must obey all traffic control signs and signals, just as motorists.
2. Bicyclists must yield to pedestrians.
3. Bicycling is prohibited on sidewalks in the Central Business District (see map) except for parking a bicycle or accessing a place of business
4. Bicycling on sidewalks outside the central business district is permitted, but discouraged for those over the age of 16.
5. Walking bicycles within crosswalks is recommended.

# Winona Biking Rules

6. Bicyclists should ride on the road, and must ride in the same direction as traffic.
7. Motorists must at all times maintain a three-foot clearance when passing a bicyclist.
8. Bicyclists must signal their turns and should ride in a predictable manner.
9. Bicyclists must use a headlight and rear reflectors when it's dark.
10. Use of a helmet is recommended for all bicyclists.

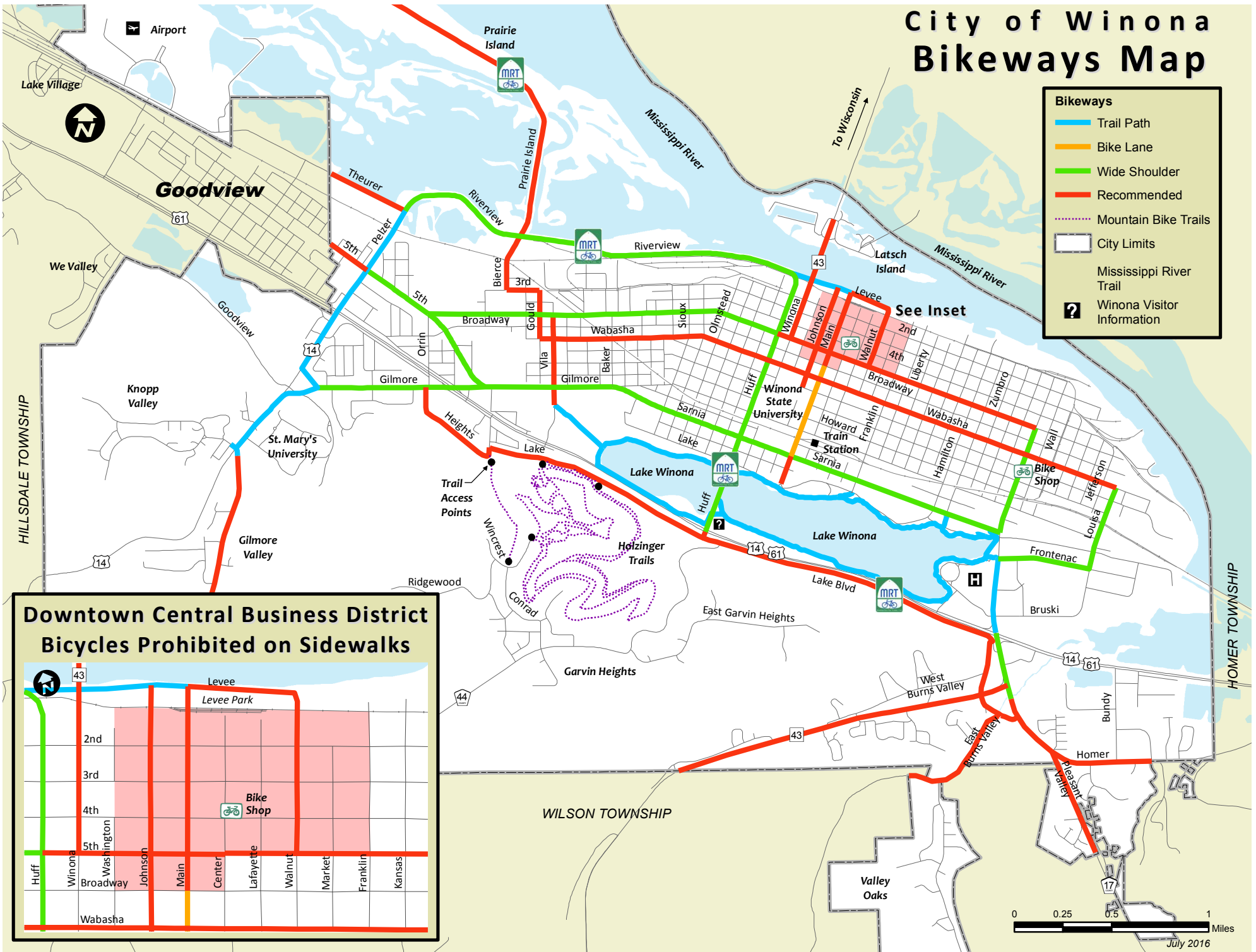
